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ST MICHAELS'S CE HIGH SCHOOL CHARGING AND REMISSIONS POLICY

RATIONALE

The Governing Body of St Michael's CE High School recognises the valuable contribution that the wide range of additional activities, including trips, clubs and residential experiences can make towards a student's personal social and academic development.

The Governing Body aims to promote and provide such activities both as part of a broad and balanced curriculum for the pupils of the school and as additional optional activities.

CONTEXT

Whilst recognising that legislation provides schools with the discretion to charge for optional extras provided wholly or mainly in school hours and to invite voluntary contributions for the benefit of the school or in support of any activity organised by the school, whether during or outside school hours, the school will always take particular account of students whose families are suffering financial hardship. Decisions will be made on educational grounds and the school will endeavour to ensure that any activities which are deemed to take place mainly or wholly in school hours do not disrupt students' education.

CHARGES

The Governing Body reserves the right to make a charge in the following circumstances for activities organised by the school.

Activities outside School Hours

The full cost to each pupil of all approved activities deemed to be optional extras that are not a necessary part of the curriculum.

Individual Instrumental Tuition

Parents may be charged a set fee approved by the Finance Committee of the Governing Body for peripatetic music provision

Damage/Loss of Property

A charge will be levied in respect of wilful damage, neglect or loss of school property (including premises, furniture, equipment, books or materials). The charge will be the cost of replacement or repair, or a lower cost may be set at the discretion of the Headteacher. A charge will be levied in respect of wilful damage, neglect or loss of property (including premises, furniture, equipment, books or materials) belonging to a third party, where the cost has been recharged to the school. The charge to be the cost of replacement or repair, or a lower cost may be set at the decision of the Headteacher.

REMISSIONS

There will be no obligation for any parent to make a contribution towards the cost of school activities. Pupils will not be treated differently whether or not their parents have made a contribution.

The Governing Body may wish to remit in full or in part the cost of other activities for particular groups of parents, for example, in the case of family hardship. When arranging a chargeable activity such parents will be invited in confidence for the remission of charges in full or in part. The Headteacher, in consultation with the Chair of Governors, will make authorisation for such remission.

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

Voluntary contributions may be requested from parents to support the cost of the following activities:

Transport costs, entrance fees, school visitors

GENERAL

The Governing Body may, from time to time, amend the categories of activity for which a charge may be made. Nothing in this policy statement precludes the Governing Body from inviting parents to make a voluntary contribution towards the cost of additional activities, which take place in school time. Parents may be advised that the continuance of an activity may depend upon voluntary contributions, but once it has been decided to run such an activity no qualifying student will be excluded on the grounds of voluntary contributions.
