Success Criteria (How will I be assessed?)	<p>GCSE History will be 100% linear assessment for the new specification first awarding in 2018.</p> <p>The two studies in depth account for 50% of the final exam over two separate exam papers.</p> <p>The two studies in breadth account for the other 50% of the final exam, unit 2B is a 45 minute exam. Unit 2F is a 1 hour 15 minute paper.</p> <p>Students will regularly be assessed for interims with linear assessments. They will be given the opportunity to attempt, and become familiar with typical exam questions.</p>
